Volunteer Background Check and Orientation Course

To protect our 4-H members, the Texas 4-H Program administers an adult screening program. This screening is conducted every 3 years. All adults who will be working directly with youth (other than their own children) must complete the adult registration form on 4-H Connect to be screened.

Once their registration has been approved from the State office, then we can certify those adults as San Patricio County volunteers. Only those adults who have been screened and cleared through YPS will have the privilege of working with 4-H members. There is a \$10 fee for each adult who will

be screened. Checks need to be made out to San Patricio 4-H Council and mailed to the Extension Office. Once a check has been received by the office, the office will mail off for the screening to be completed.

The Texas 4-H & Youth Development Program is pleased to announce the availability of an online orientation course for 4-H volunteers. Orientation is only one step in the process of managing volunteers, but a very important one. The orientation step is key to getting the best and most from your volunteers. In fact, it is best to never assume that your volunteers fully understand Extension and the 4-H program and the roles they play to support its mission.

The goal of this course is to provide volunteers with an understanding of the organizational structure of the Texas AgriLife Extension Service

and how the 4-H program operates. It also helps volunteers recognize their roles and responsibilities within the structure and program. Specifically, the course provides information on the following:

An overview of the Texas AgriLife Extension Service

- 4-H 101: Facts about 4-H
- An overview of the various methods of participation available in the 4-H program
- Volunteer qualifications, roles in which volunteers may serve

and the responsibilities associated with each role

- A list of various resources for 4-H volunteers
- The course is available online at: http://campus.extension.org and can be completed within one hour. If a volunteer cannot complete the orientation in one sitting, they do have the capabilities to come back to it at a later time. Once the course is complete, volunteers may print off a completion certificate.



October: Program Idea

Recordbooks are usually focused upon in the spring. However, many 4-H parents say they wish they knew what is necessary to complete a recordbook prior to a couple months before the due date. So, October is a great ti me to have a program on record keeping skills. Have a 4-H club leader, or teen leader, give a presentation on how to keep records, the different

methods involved, and what records need to be kept for the purposes of completing a 4-H Recordbook.

Since National 4-H Week is celebrated this month, have some 4-H members present their illustrated talk from the "promote 4-H" category. It is okay if the presentation they use was one they competed with the previous year! Invite a county 4-H Ambassador to your 4-H club meeting and have them give a 4-H promotion presentation.
